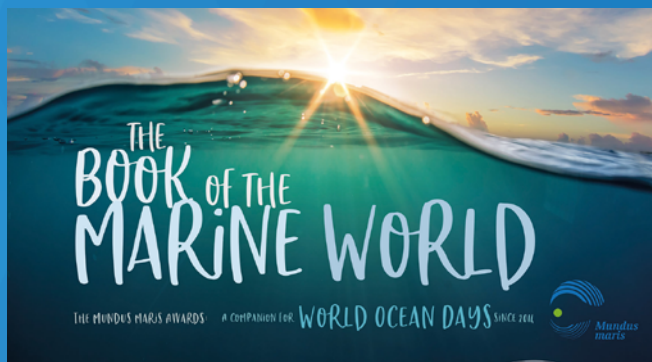


About *Mundus maris*

Our Flagship Projects

Small-Scale Fisheries Academy

The Academy is a safe, multi-actor space for respectful dialogue, joint learning, and innovation aimed at restoring and sustainably using marine and coastal resources.



Mundus maris offers this Academy to support the operationalisation of the FAO Voluntary Guidelines for Ensuring Sustainable Small-Scale Fisheries in the context of food security and poverty eradication. Focus areas include collaborative ways of capacity strengthening, gender equity, and support to improved livelihoods.



World Ocean Day

Each year, we celebrate World Ocean Day with clean-ups, educational events, workshops, concerts, and exhibitions across continents.



These activities raise awareness about urgent restoration of ocean health and the importance of regenerative practices, as well as promote ocean literacy and stewardship in collaboration with partners in Africa, Europe, and Latin America.



The Seafood We Eat

Mundus maris informs about food security and safety, health, and encourages citizen engagement towards sustainably sourced seafood by offering workshops, webinars, presentations and the FishBase Guide app to shepherd people through these interconnected issues.



Fostering Ocean Literacy

We engage the next generation through debates and role plays developed for young adults. For example, the “Protecting Blue Horizons” role play simulates dialogue between municipalities, NGOs, fishers and other stakeholders about creating social consensus to make a Marine Protected Area work. Materials are available free of charge to any interested institution.
